The bulk of the Prop 10 funds (80%) go directly to County Commissions. County Commissions develop strategic plans consistent with the California Children and Families Commission (CCFC) guidelines on funding local child development programs and services, but have maximum flexibility in tailoring funding and programs to local needs. County Commissions obtain broad public input and submit audits on spending to the CCFC. Prop. 10 mandates that each Commission form at least one advisory committee to provide expertise and support.

The Butte County Commission is dedicated to identifying and supporting the provision of a countywide, comprehensive, integrated system of early childhood development and health services that will lay the emotional, social, physical and intellectual foundation for each child to thrive and enter school ready to learn and later become a productive, well adjusted member of society.
